# Erosion and Soil Protection Soil Erosion as a Challenge for Local Authorities

Soil erosion is actually a natural geological phenomenon, but constitutes one of the key dangers for soils worldwide. According to estimates by the FAO, every year 10 million hectares of agricultural land are lost through erosion throughout the world. The European Environment Agency (EEA) estimates that a good 17% of the surface area in the "old" countries and 35% of the "new" countries in the European Union are affected by erosion. The causes and scope of erosion are complex and vary greatly according to the local situation.

The Alps with their geomorphology are particularly at risk. Erosion damage such as landslides and flooding can assume disastrous dimensions, jeopardising lives and causing millions of Euros of damage every year. Costly refurbishment and prevention measures such as erosion protection structures and reforestation projects are attempts to counteract this trend.

The European Land and Soil Alliance (ELSA), was formed in October 2000 in Bolzano, Italy and became established in 2002 as a registered association with headquarters in Osnabrück (D), wants to pay more attention to this problem.

Accordingly, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Conference has been entitled " Erosion and Soil Protection – Soil Erosion as a Challenge for Local Authorities". Which dimensions have erosion processes reached in Europe? What is the connection between forms of land use and erosion? Which countermeasures have been tested and are promising? Are monitoring systems a suitable instrument for prevention?

We would like to discuss these and other questions with interested participants from politics, the authorities, the environment and industry.
